How Quest Works

Quest turns everyday household chores into a fun adventure. Parents create tasks and assign star rewards. Children complete tasks, take a photo as proof, and submit for review. Once approved, stars are credited automatically — and children can spend them in the reward shop you set up.



Parent

Create tasks, set star rewards, review photo proof, run the reward shop.



Child

Complete tasks, submit photo proof, earn stars, level up, buy rewards.

What You Need

- 1 iPhone or iPad**
iOS 21 or later. Quest runs on both iPhone and iPad.
 - 2 iCloud Account**
Sign in to iCloud on each device (Settings → Your Name → iCloud). Required for multi-device sync.
 - 3 Quest App on Every Device**
Download Quest on both the parent's device and the child's device.
 - 4 Stable Internet Connection**
Needed during initial setup and task sync. Works offline after loading.

Initial Setup

Takes about 3 minutes. Do this on the parent's device first.

- 1 Open Quest and tap "Create Family"**

Enter your family name and your name. Choose your avatar (Mom or Dad). Tap Create — your 6-character family code is generated.
- 2 Share the family code with your child**

Tap "Share Code" on the Home screen or go to Settings → Family Code. Send it via Messages, WhatsApp, or show it directly.
- 3 Child opens Quest and taps "I have a code"**

The child enters the 6-character code, types their name, selects Boy or Girl, and taps Join. Their profile appears on your Home screen instantly.
- 4 Add your first reward**

Go to the Rewards tab → tap "+". Give it a name (e.g. Ice Cream), set a star cost, pick an emoji. This motivates children from day one.
- 5 Create your first task**

Tap "+" on the Home screen or the Tasks tab. Choose a category, write a title, set the star reward, and optionally require a photo proof. Tap Create.

Creating Tasks

Tasks are the core of Quest. Each task has a star reward that the child earns upon approval.

⚠ Always set a meaningful star reward. If a task is worth 5 stars but a toy costs 100, children get discouraged. A good ratio: simple chore = 2–5 ⭐, big task = 10–20 ⭐.

- 1 Tap "+" and choose a child**

On the Home screen or Tasks tab. If you have several children, select who gets the task.
- 2 Select a category and template**

9 categories: Homework, Chores, Hygiene, Reading, Sport, Cooking, Pet Care, Bedtime, Other. Each has ready-made templates — tap one to pre-fill the title.
- 3 Set the title and description**

Write what needs to be done. Add a description for extra detail or record a voice message the child will hear.
- 4 Set star reward and photo proof**

Choose how many stars the task is worth. Toggle "Require photo proof" if you want the child to attach a photo as evidence.
- 5 Optional: add deadline or make it recurring**

Set a due date, or enable recurring on specific weekdays. Recurring tasks automatically reappear every week.

💡 Use built-in illustrations or upload a custom photo as the task cover — children pay more attention to visual tasks.

How the Child Completes a Task

- 1 Child opens Quest → Tasks tab**
All assigned tasks appear here with their star reward clearly shown.
- 2 Tap the task → tap Submit**
If photo proof is required, the camera opens. Take a photo or choose from the gallery. Add an optional text or voice comment.
- 3 Task goes to "Pending Review"**
You receive a push notification. The task appears in your Review tab.
- 4 Parent opens Review tab**
View the photo, read the comment, and tap Approve or Return for revision. If returning, write what needs to be fixed.
- 5 Stars are awarded automatically**
Once approved, stars are added to the child's balance. A celebration animation plays on the child's device.

Rewards & Shop

The reward shop is the main motivation engine. Children save stars and spend them on rewards you create.

- ★ **Create a reward** — Rewards tab → tap "+". Set name, icon (emoji or photo), and star cost. Template ideas: Ice Cream, Movie Night, New Toy, Trip to Park, Extra Game Time.
- ★ **Child buys a reward** — In the Shop tab, child taps a reward and confirms. Stars are deducted immediately. A "Pending" entry appears in your Rewards tab.
- ★ **Parent redeems** — When you give the actual reward (ice cream, toy, etc.), tap Redeem in the Rewards tab → Pending. The purchase is marked as completed.

Rank System — My Journey

Children level up as they earn stars. Each level unlocks a new rank with a unique character. There are 12 ranks total — from Star to Legend.

Troubleshooting

Child's tasks don't appear on parent's device

Both devices must be connected to iCloud. Check Settings → Apple ID → iCloud. Pull down to refresh on the Home screen.

Family code not found

The code is case-insensitive but must be exactly 6 characters. Make sure iCloud is active on the parent's device where the family was created.

Push notifications not arriving

Go to iPhone Settings → Quest → Notifications and enable Allow Notifications. Also check that Do Not Disturb is not active.

Photo can't be attached

Go to iPhone Settings → Quest → Camera and Photos and grant access. The child needs camera/photo library permission.

Stars not updating after approval

Pull down to refresh on the child's device. If the issue persists, both devices need internet connection for CloudKit sync.
